What's in a Bushel?

Originally, a bushel was a measure of volume containing 2,152.42 cubic inches, but now the accepted standard for a bushel of shelled corn is measured by weight: 56 pounds - approximately the size of a large bag of pet food. Color the items below that all have corn in them!



From 1 bushel of corn, we can make:

33 pounds of starch

or

2.8 gallons of ethanol AND 17.5
pounds distillers grains

or

38 boxes of cereal
